Taranaki, located on the west coast of New Zealand's North Island, is the region of choice for students who want to study and live in a vibrant, contemporary, and unique place with copious things to do, see, eat, and experience alongside welcoming, connected, and caring communities.

Taranaki is a region forging its own path forward towards a future that reflects a shared vision: a high value, low-emissions economy built on inclusivity and sustainability. Taranaki is also award-winning, with its main centre New Plymouth awarded the world's most livable city for its size in 2021 by the UN-backed International Awards for Liveable Communities. This accolade is due to the region's many jewels including the coastal walkway, parks and green spaces, nationally acclaimed airport, Govett-Brewster Art Gallery and Len Lye Centre with its iconic façade, and world-class events such as WOMAD and TSB Festival of Lights.

In 2021 and 2022 Taranaki recorded the most sunshine hours in New Zealand, making the region the sunniest in the country. We invite students to come and thrive in our quality schools and tertiary institutes, which promote innovative thinking, talent development and individualised learning programmes.

Our culture and heritage

The history of the region's people is diverse and colourful.

Māori are tangata whenua (people of the land), the indigenous people of Aotearoa. In Te Ao Māori (the Māori world view) the most important thing is He Tangata (our people) and Taiao (our Environment).

The health and wellbeing of the people, the land, waterways, and moana (ocean) is a key focus to ensure culturally connected, strong and resilient people who will sustain our environment for generations to come.

In the Taranaki region, those who descend from their tupuna maunga (ancestral mountain) Taranaki, belong to one of eight iwi; Ngāti Tama, Ngāti Mutunga, Ngāti Maru, Te Atiawa, Taranaki, Ngāruahine, Ngāti Ruanui, and Ngā Rauru. Each iwi is a collective of hapū (kinship group), which are collectives of whānau (family) with their own views, cultural practices,

and history. The first Europeans arrived in the 1820s, adding to a rich tapestry that continues to be woven today.

Many schools will include visiting a marae (traditional meeting house) and learning about Māori culture as part of the student experience.

While you are here, there are museums and art galleries to visit throughout the region that celebrate our culture and heritage.

The three official languages of Aotearoa New Zealand are English, Te Reo Māori, and New Zealand sign language.

Climate

With the most sunshine hours recorded for two years running, Taranaki is a popular holiday destination and soughtafter place to live and work. Situated on the western side of the North Island and with Taranaki Maunga (Mount Taranaki) sitting in the heart of the region stretching to the Tasman Sea, Taranaki experiences moderate weather.

The temperate climate is ideal for outdoor activities, including an endless coastline to explore and Taranaki Maunga paved with thousands of kilometres of walking tracks. February is the warmest and driest month with an average temperature of 22 °C, the coldest month is July with an average maximum daytime temperature of 13°C.

Activities

Taranaki boasts vibrant festivals and events, epic surf breaks, natural attractions, lots of free (or affordable) activities, and award-winning galleries and museums to visit. Students are also spoilt for choice with the region's excellent facilities and clubs that cater to a wide range of hobbies, there's something for everyone no matter what your interests are. Students can enjoy the cinema, take a surf lesson, hike the region's many tracks and trails, play sport, shop, swim, skate, create, sing, and play music.

Taste of Taranaki

Eat your way around Taranaki in the many bustling cafes, restaurants, specialist eateries, and food markets. From American style milkshakes, gourmet burgers, European and Asian fusion cuisines, Taranaki has it all and more. Some eateries use only 100% local, seasonal produce sourced from local growers and producers. Eating out has never tasted so good in Taranaki.

Getting around

The region's compact size makes travel easy and you're never too far away from where you need to go. There is a comprehensive school bus network throughout Taranaki. Students can buy a bus card which allows them to travel on all city and regional buses, along with great cycle and walking networks. WITT Te Pūkenga students have free travel as part of their study package, and national intercity bus services also operate daily.



Quality institutions

Students in Taranaki secondary schools consistently achieve pass rates above the national average and vocational tertiary students find employment in exciting roles. Students can choose their course of study and focus on subjects they are good at and enjoy. They'll also have the opportunity to take part in extracurricular activities and develop their individual talents.

Improve your English

Improve your English in classes with small numbers of international students and get the chance to participate in everything a school has to offer. From the excitement of

swimming sports to the privileged insight into Kapa Haka (Māori performing arts), Taranaki schools offer a real kiwi experience.

Friendly people, safe and caring communities


Homestays are carefully chosen, and homestay families ensure that their students get out into the community and mix with locals as well as attending regular get-togethers with other international students. Education providers also help students settle by providing pastoral care for new students, and personally checking, and police vetting all homestay options.

You can expect a high standard of accommodation, with hostels and homestays costing around NZ \$300 - \$340 per week, including meals and utilities. You will pay around \$150 - \$250 per week plus utilities and food per room in private rental accommodation.


Pathways to employment


