Studies show that up to 60% of jobs are secured through networking rather than traditional job advertisements. This makes leveraging your personal and professional networks a key strategy in your job search.

Top tips on turning 'it's not what you know but who you know' to your advantage:

Use Social Media Effectively

Platforms like LinkedIn and Facebook can be invaluable tools for job hunting. Update your profile to showcase your skills, achievements, and job preferences. Post a message asking your connections about potential opportunities or upcoming roles. If you're not active on these platforms yet, now is a great time to create an account.

Reach Out to Personal Connections

Tap into your existing network by talking to friends or family members working in other companies. Ask if they know of job openings or if they can pass on your CV to their HR department. Networking is a common and effective strategy, so don't hesitate to use it.

Promote Yourself in Social Circles

Make your job search known within your social groups, clubs, or hobbies—particularly if they involve relevant skills. For instance, members of a car restoration club might have industry connections that could lead to job opportunities.

Act on Leads Immediately

Whenever you hear about a potential job, follow it up without delay. Reach out to the company directly—whether by calling, sending an email, or visiting in person. Being proactive can set you apart from other candidates.

LOCAL NETWORKS

Building networks is one of the most effective ways to grow both personally and professionally. Whether you're connecting with like-minded individuals or exploring new opportunities, the following suggestions highlight just a small selection of ways to develop your network in Taranaki.

Taranaki Chamber of Commerce

The Chamber offers a variety of networking events, such as Business Connections and the Network of Trades, providing opportunities to meet professionals across different industries. By becoming a Friend of the Chamber, you gain access to these events.

Taranaki Young Professionals (TYP)

Designed for those in the first 15 years of their career, TYP organizes both professional and social events, fostering connections with other young professionals in the region.

Sport Taranaki

Sports clubs and events are a great way to meet people while staying active. Sport Taranaki provides information about various clubs and activities happening throughout the region.

Local Libraries and Councils

A great way to find out what's available to do in your community is to contact your local library or district council: New Plymouth District Council, Stratford District Council and South Taranaki District Council.

HTPKT invites you to explore the dynamic world of indigenous businesses in Taranaki. They host hui and networking events designed to foster connections and promote Te Ao Māori values, supporting the growth and success of indigenous entrepreneurship. WHERE TO FIND JOB LISTINGS

Jobs are advertised in several places, so it's worth keeping an eye on all the following. In most cases, you can set up alerts to send you an new jobs in your skill area, or region, or both are listed.

- The Taranaki Jobs website, facilitated by Venture Taranaki, lists vacancies in the region in one easy to find place.
- Seek is one of the key online job listing sites and is worth checking regularly. You can search listings by classification (industry), region, keyword and salary band. It's free to register and you can receive alerts about new jobs.
- The other main job listing site is Trade Me Jobs, which also offers a range of search options across region, industry, and salary.
- The Government Jobs website lists opportunities across all government departments.
- The Ministry of Social Development have their Kimi Mahi Mai Find a Job platform which are locally sourced jobs.
- There are also several companies who offer internship and graduate roles, check them out the Venture Taranaki Internship page.

RECRUITMENT AGENCIES

Using recruitment agencies can be a highly effective way to explore additional job opportunities and gain a foothold in companies you might not otherwise access. Often, this will involve a meeting where you discuss your career path, skills, and the roles you're looking for. Recruitment agencies tend to specialize in specific industries or job types, so selecting one or two that align with your desired sector can significantly improve your chances of success.

Below is a list of agencies in Taranaki, along with a brief overview of their areas of focus:

Adecco

For temporary and permanent placements in a range of industry sectors.

Allied Workforce (AWF)

For temporary staff placement into the labour, manufacturing, and trades industries.

GMA Consulting

Primarily recruits for executive level positions.

NES Fircroft

Technical and engineering recruitment specialists providing staffing solutions (permanent and contract) within energy, construction, chemical, IT and manufacturing sectors.

Onestaff

Recruitment for industrial, manufacturing and construction sectors.

Programmed

For temporary and permanent placements in a range of industry sectors.
